#### Smile Zone




"Healthy Happy Smiles" is what I have been teaching this month in dental health classroom instructions. Giving new tooth brushes and dental floss to our students is won-



# **Human Trafficking Prevention Efforts**

The mission of Soroptimist of Zanesville is to help girls and women in a variety of ways. Helping them to escape human trafficking is a high priority for our members.

A project that is being undertaken now is to provide information to victims of sex trafficking on bars of soap provided in bathrooms at truck stops and motels around town. The club purchased a case of

1000 bars of soap and made printed labels to wrap around the bars. The labels contain the toll-free phone number and texting information of the Human Trafficking Resource Center and website of the Polaris Project. Both of these organizations rescue trafficked people.

Often the only private time a victim

would have is in the bathroom so placing the information to get help on soap bars is one way we can help these victims out of a horrific situation.

At the February meeting we started to attach the labels to the bars and will continue at the March meeting.
