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Soroptimist International of Zanesville introduces The Follow Your Dream Grant Program in conjunction with the Muskingum County Community Foundation



Earlier this year our club discussed the feasibility of changing up how we do our education awards so that we can help more women in our community and make a wider impact. After several months of planning, The SIZ Follow Your Dream Grant is finally coming to fruition!

We have worked with The Muskingum County Community Foundation to establish a fund that will be used to provide financial assistance to women and girls for education and employment. The goal of this fund is to remove the obstacles that prevent a woman in Muskingum County from

improving herself through education and employment opportunities. These small grants can be used to cover expenses that would not be covered by traditional financial aid, such as background checks, uniforms, transcript fees, etc.

The hope is that the application form will go live in December and that the first awards can be distributed in January of 2024. The applications can be downloaded directly from the SIZ website and from a link from the MCCF website. We have made the initial deposit to the fund in the amount of \$1500, with the same amount donated each year. We also have the ability to revisit this amount and add more to it as we deem necessary, and if any money remains at the end of the year, it will roll over to the next year.

It is very exciting to work with MCCF because they have access to donors who would like to provide additional money to the fund, and donations can be made for the Follow Your Dream fund directly through the MCCF website. Brian Wagner and Amy Luby of MCCF both said that this fund is much needed in Muskingum County because there is no other assistance like it that focuses only on helping women and girls. They said they are looking forward to seeing the success of this program.

We do need to form a committee to review the applications and make the award recommendations. If you are interested in being on the committee speak with Donna Snider, Molly Ross or Amy Hursey as soon as possible.
