
COMMITTEE REPORTS

Use of the Word "Disadvantaged"

You may have noticed that recently SIA started to use the phrase "disadvantaged women and girls" to describe the population we target. We began using this phrase when we realized not all our clubs and leaders were on the same page when it came to identifying the women and girls we want to help. We took our cue from the United Nations—which uses this term to describe women and girls most in need of assistance—to help educate our members, clubs and leaders. We have heard from several members that they found the use of this term offensive because it labels our target population of women and girls. It was never our intention to disrespect the amazing women and girls we serve. Your SIA Board and staff took the objections seriously and changed the phrase we use to describe our target population to: women and girls who have faced obstacles such as poverty, violence and teen pregnancy. We thank our members who took the time to bring their objections to our attention.
